Subj: ALCOHOL SALES IN NAVY EXCHANGES

Ref: (a) OPNAVINST 1700.16A  
(b) OPNAVINST 1700.7E

1. Per references (a) and (b), the sale of alcoholic beverages on naval installations must be balanced with non-alcoholic beverages and recreational activities to encourage healthful lifestyles for Sailors and their families.

2. To support the intent of the 21st Century Sailor Program, Navy Exchange Command will take the following actions:

a. Restrict all distilled spirit sales to main exchanges or dedicated package store facilities. Commander, Navy Supply Systems Command, in consultation with Commander, Navy Installations Command (CNIC), will consider exceptions to this policy for locations not served by a main exchange.

b. Limit the floor space dedicated to the sale and display of alcoholic beverages in locations other than package stores to no more than 10 percent of total retail floor space available. Alcoholic products and displays should be in a consolidated location at the rear of the facility.


c. Make single-use alcohol detection devices available for sale in Navy Exchange facilities.

d. Limit hours for the sale of alcoholic beverages to 0600 to 2200.

3. Facilities outside of the continental United States (other than Hawaii and Guam) will be evaluated by CNIC on a site-by-site basis, consistent with existing ration programs and applicable Status of Forces Agreements.

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4. The above actions will be completed no later than 90 days from the date of this letter. These changes will be incorporated in the next revision to references (a) and (b).
